For example a performance about road safety might be for the target audience of primary school children.	Ideas Log Your initial ideas for performance need to be logged considering your style of performance, practitioner influence and theme. You would also write about your contribution to the performance	Skills Log In your skills log you need to write about your role within the performance group, the skills and techniques you used in the performance and rehearsals and how these developed over time. You would also discuss how practitioners have influenced your performance work.
Personal review Component 3 requires you to write a review on how your performance went, strengths of your performance and areas for improvement. This requires for you to be reflective. There are different review points throughout the unit with peer review taking place also.	Creative Intentions Creative intentions are the reasons, goals, or purposes behind a performance. They represent the "why" of a creative project, encompassing the desired outcome, message, or impact the creator hopes to achieve	Investigate To research, study, examine a theatre company looking at their context, intention, stylistic qualities, style and genre and purpose, this then should inform your ideas creatively for component 3	Artaud He was a writer and performer who believed people were savages with secret desires to commit sins, he created the concept of the Theatre of Cruelty. A lot of his theatre work was abstract to push the audience to their limits and make them think	Naturalistic acting The art of acting in a way that is true and imitating real life. Konstantin Stanislavski is held as the main theatre practitioner to influence this style of performance
Non-naturalistic acting A style of acting that is removed from naturalistic acting. Exaggerated acting, physical theatre and other techniques may be used in this style of acting. Bertolt Brecht was seen as one of the main non-naturalistic theatre practitioners	The Paper Birds Are a devising theatre company that explores social issues happening in the word today. They use real interviews to inform their devised work. Their style of theatre is often called 'verbatim theatre'	Wise Children Wise Children are an ensemble theatre company. Wise Children adapt existing stories, often from short stories and novels. Puppetry, ensemble work, animated video, deliberate theatricality, dance, music and song are used in this particular style.	Steven Berkoff Is an English actor, director and writer with his own theatre style. He uses the concept of total theatre in his performance work. The use of ensemble, mime, exaggerated vocal and physical work, direct address and tableaux, which are all elements of his performance work	500
